The features exhibited here are as much an exploration of the possibilities of documentary filmmaking as they are of their individual subjects. The films are meant to be consumed in ways quite different from the traditional linear narrative of documentary films. Rather than sitting in front of a large screen, the audience is encouraged to explore subjects at different times, on different screens, and with different outcomes. They also call upon their viewers to become participants in their creation.

The three films featured, Elaine McMillion's *Hollow*, Katerina Cizek's *Higrise*, and *Whale Hunt* by Jonathon Harris, each have a unique interactive aspect that allow the viewer to participate in the experience of the film.

With these projects, BSDFF hopes to broaden perceptions about what documentaries are and what stories can be told with them. As reality continues to play itself, you are encouraged to play with reality.
